**The Highway ISAC has received the following report from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement. Additional details regarding the incidents described below have been provided to the Highway ISAC from Highway Watch® Program participants for further analysis and distribution. Please note that while law enforcement is actively seeking more information regarding these incidents and the person pictured in the accompanying attachment, to date the Highway ISAC is unaware of any illegal activity associated with the reported incidents. The person(s) described or pictured are of interest to Law Enforcement but are not to be considered suspects of any illegal activity. Please see the attached photographs of the person of interest. Ft. Myers, FL, April 19, 2005:

At approximately 0500 hours an identified driver for an identified fuel distributor, advised while unloading fuel at the Mobile Station located at 2391 Summerlin Road, Ft. Myers, a subject approached him and asked several questions regarding the tank trailer and its load capacity. The subject then proceeded to take a small video camera, appearing to have antennae on it and started recording the undercarriage of the tanker trailer. The subject also had a small notebook. The subject filmed the truck twice before going inside of the Mobile Station and asking the clerk about the ATM machine and whether the donuts were fresh, when there was a donut truck parked beside the store.

Subject was described as:

Dark complexion, Black short wavy hair, early 50's, Good language, Poss. Subject was driving a white car with a further description pending. No tag number was recorded.

Note: Security Camera video obtained.

Ringo, GA, one year ago:

On 5/2/05 SA Myers made contact with a representative of a tank truck company in Ringo, GA. The rep recounted a similar incident about 1 year ago where 2 subjects were taking pictures of their tanker trucks. SA Myers forwarded photos of the subject of this tip to another company who distributed a bulletin with photos on the subject to associate fuel truck companies. Parker stated there were 2 subjects at their location: one tall and skinny with a beard and the driver about 6-7 inches shorter. Parker stated she was 95% sure the driver was the same subject. Parker stated she contacted the FBI in reference to their incident.

Incident, Tampa, FL, May 27, 2005:

On 05/26/2005 at 0630 hours an unidentified subject approached a fuel tanker truck driver, unloading fuel at the Hess Station located at U.S. 301 and Martin Luther King Blvd. in Tampa. Subject entered the coned off area and told the driver he wanted to ask him some questions. Driver instructed the subject to leave the area and started to call the police on his cell phone at which time the subject left. No tag number was obtained and there is no store video of the fuel drop area. Driver states the subject looked like the subject in a bulletin released showing the subject committing a similar act in Ft. Myers. Note: No security camera video available.
